Ecopolypse

Simulating the world economic crisis in a room, ECOPOLYPSE, one of the core events of Arthotasava, saw heated debate on various Economic issues like US-China Trade War, Illegal Immigration etc. where every participant, representing a country, defended their country's policies and negotiated with each other to solve the specific crisis. An overview of Activities organized from July 2018-March 2019:-

Dr S. Radhakrishnan Book Club Activities-

On 5th September 2018, on the occasion of Teacher's Day, the History Department under the Teacher-in-Chargeship of Dr. Richa Malhotra inaugurated the Dr S. Radhakrishnan Book Club. First lecture of the Book Club was delivered by Dr Rakesh Batabyal, Professor, Centre of Media Studies, JNU, on the topic 'The idea of a Teacher in an expanding knowledge Universe'. The Time Travellers celebrated the teacher's day with full zest and zeal.

On 5 October 2018, the Dr S. Radhakrishnan Book Club of the History Department had organized its 2nd Book Club Meet. The books in discussion were 'Karma Bhoomi' by Munshi Premchand and 'The Difficulty of Being Good' by Gurcharan Das. This was followed by a mesmerizing lecture on 'History, Memory and Narrative: Partition of India Revisited' by Professor Sucheta Mahajan, Chairperson, Centre for Historical Studies, School of Social Sciences, JNU.

The Dr S. Radhakrishnan Book Club organized a trip to the World Book Fair on 12 January 2019 to develop an interest in enchanting world of books as well as to inculcate a reading spirit. The students were accompanied by Dr Richa Malhotra and Dr Virendra Singh Bithoo.

Study trip to Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh-

The students of B.A. History (Hons) had the privilege of visiting the Heart of India- Madhya Pradesh. The study trip was organised by the Time Travellers, the History Society of the college from 17 January 2019-21 January 2019 accompanied by faculty members Dr. Shalini Singhal, Dr. Richa Malhotra, Dr. Vedbrat Tiwari and Dr. Virendra Singh Bithoo. The students got an opportunity to admire the kaleidoscopic journey of mankind from the Paleolithic time till the present day. They visited a plethora of significant places including Bhimbhetka Caves, Bhojpur Temple, Satdhara Stupas, Sanchi Stupa, Udaygiri Caves and Vidisha. Study trip and Volunteering at Indian History Congress, Bhopal-

The students of the History Department of CVS had the privilege of volunteering for the 79th session of the Indian History Congress held in Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh from 26-28 February 2019. It was one of a rarest kind of experience for the students as they got an exclusive opportunity (while volunteering), to attend the lectures and interact with the galaxy of stalwarts of Indian history and eminent thinkers of Indian society and culture including Professor Irfan Habib,

Prof Mridula Mukherjee, Prof. Aditya Mukherjee, Prof. K. M. Shrimali, Prof Shireen Moosvi, among many more illustrious speakers.

Academic Visits, Workshops, Heritage Walks in Delhi-

On 21 August 2018, the students of B.A. History (Hons), second year, had the privilege of attending a session on the stories written by Amir Khusro, the revered Sufi mystic and poet of the Delhi Sultanate era on in the Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts (IGNCA), Janpath. The session was conducted by Mr Pradeep Sharma Khusro, a self-taught scholar of one of India's greatest and legendary poets, Amir Khusro. Followed by this, the students visited the Conservation Laboratory in the centre where they were given a practical demonstration about how manuscripts and various other artefacts from our past are conserved, preserved and stored using ingenious chemical and physical processes.

On 6 September 2018, students of B.A. History (Hons), second year, reading the paper 'Museums and Archives' (SEC), visited the National Archives of India to explore the exhibition on proscribed literature during the Quit India Movement where they got a chance to view the original and rare documents, pamphlets, books and newsletters written during our freedom struggle both in vernacular languages and Hindi. It was a knowledgeable and informative experience for the students.

On 18 September 2018, the History department organized a study tour to Rashtrapati Bhawan Museum to attend a lecture on 'Architecture of Power: Lutyens, Baker and New Delhi' by prominent author and historian, Dr. Swapna Liddle. This visit was specially organized for the students reading the paper, 'Making of Contemporary India' (GE, third semester) and 'Cultures in the Indian Subcontinent' (Tourism, fifth semester) students. The lecture revealed myriad facts and facets of the architectural development in 20th century India. It was an enlightening experience and helped the students to garner an in-depth understanding of the art and architecture of pre-independence India.

On 24 September 2018, students of History (Hons), second year, along with students reading the paper 'Delhi Through the Ages' (GE) went for a heritage walk led by eminent journalist , Mr Prakash K. Ray to Qutub Complex and Mehrauli Archaeological Park. The students were accompanied by Dr. Mrinal Pingua and Dr. Virendra Singh Bithoo. They visited the Qutub Minar Complex which is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and not just includes the majestic Qutub Minar but also many other relics like the Quwwat-ul-Islam Mosque , Alai Darwaza, Iron Pillar and Alauddin Khilji's tomb. Followed by this , they visited the Mehrauli Archaeological Park where they saw the enchanting Jamali Kamali Mosque , the tomb of Balban, Rajon Ki Baoli, Tomb of Quli Khan , Jahaz Mahal to name a few. Finally, the students went to the Tomb of Adham Khan commonly called as the Bhool Bhulaiya. The students got a chance to understand and comprehend the reasons behind the construction of these grandiose structures, their architecture and various other facets related to them.

On 3rd October 2018 Students of History (Hons.), second year, reading the paper 'Museums and Archives' (SEC), visited the National Museum of India with Ms. Anu Singh and Dr. Vedbrat Tiwari. They also attended a lecture on 'Heritage Sites and Scientific Conservation Methods' organised by the Conservation Department of the museum.

On 27 October 2018, the Time Travellers, the History Society of CVS organized a study visit to the National Museum of India for students of B.A. History (Hons), first year. Accompanied by Dr. Richa Malhotra and Dr. Vedbrat Tiwari the students visited various galleries of the museum to enhance their understanding of Indian history including the 'Harappan Civilisation Gallery', 'Maurya, Shunga and Satavahana Art Gallery', 'Buddhist Art Gallery' and 'Indian Miniature Paintings Gallery'. The students also saw the ongoing exhibition titled 'Peru's Fabulous Treasures'.

On 2nd November 2018, the Time Travellers, the History Society of CVS organised a visit to the National Handicrafts and Handlooms Museum (Crafts Museum) for the students of B.A. History (Hons), second year. Students were accompanied by Assistant Professor Dr. Virendra Singh Bithoo. It was an enriching experience for the students as they got an opportunity to understand and explore the various shades of our rich culture manifested in artifacts, paintings, rural architecture, textiles, murals, music and dance forms.

GARDEN COMMITTEE

The Garden Committee has continued with developing the garden and environs of the College.

The herbal and vegetable gardens are doing well, the nursery for plants and herbs has expanded, and the compost pit for in-house organic manure generates a good deal of manure for the plants on campus.

The rockery and the stone garden at the entrance are both flourishing. Fencing of all the beds in the garden has been done, using waste material from the college. Pots with plants that help to clean the particulate matter in the air, have been placed around the College, and teachers and students were encouraged to take these home. 50 palm trees were planted on the path along the open gym and staff quarters. The area near the new academic block is also being developed with bamboo and evergreen plants .

GREEN BRIGADE

Green Brigade, the environment society of CVS is a platform through which students enlighten themselves and others about the importance of pressing environmental issues and sustainable development. Green Brigade has been active throughout the year and organised various events – Tree Plantation, Awareness Drives, Talks, Workshops, Quizzes, Nukkad Nataks and Nature Walk to explore the different ideas that students may embark upon.

Activities conducted during the year

On Founder's Day, 14th August, 2018, the students, teaching and non-teaching staff of the college joined the worldwide campaign to "Beat Plastic Pollution" and took a pledge to adopt "Green good behaviour" as well as "Green Social Responsibility." A solemn pledge was made to eliminate all single-use plastic from our college campus in the near future.

In accord with the proposal submitted to the Governing Body of the College to obliterate single-use plastic from the college campus, we have been successful in removing plastic straws and stirrers from the canteen. We are hopeful that in the future we will be able to completely remove single-use plastic from our canteen.

On 29th August 2018, a talk was organised by Ms. Smriti Singh and Ms. Mehul Goyal, Chintan Environmental Research and Action group to talk about harms of single-use and micro-plastic. Followed by the screening of the movie, "Beat the Plastic", and finally a presentation by Mr. Prayash Darjee, student of Ramjas College who discussed his indigenous innovation of refurbishing plastic into cushions.

A plantation drive was organised on 20th August, 2018 on campus for the teaching and non-teaching staff as well as the students. We also participated in the tree plantation drive conducted by the Delhi Government on 8th September in Millennium Park, Chirag Delhi, to increase the green cover and combat air pollution.

On 5th and 7th September, 2018, an awareness drive was conducted for the non-teaching and teaching staff of the college, to highlight the hazardous and catastrophic effects of single-use plastics on our health and environment. In this context, an initiative was taken to distribute cloth bags to non-teaching and teaching staff, to facilitate and

encourage the use of non- plastic bags for their daily provisions, rather than using polythene bags. This is a small step to erase our carbon foot print and conserve the planet.

We participated in the 'Swachhata Hi Seva' programme of the Ministry of Sanitation and Drinking Water to make a difference in our environment and spread awareness regarding waste segregation , cleanliness and plastic pollution. In this regard, we had organised three activities in Sheikh Sarai-II :

- Cleanliness Drive (25 September 2018)
- Awareness Drive and Door to Door Campaign (29 September 2018)- regarding plastic pollution, waste segregation, anti littering and anti smoking in public places in the pockets-K and L of Sheikh Sarai-II.
- Swachhata Rally (30 September 2019)- A Swachhata Rally was organised in pockets-K and L of Sheikh Sarai-II. At the end of the event, students as well as the residents took a pledge to conserve and protect our environment.

Nukkad-Natak Performances by various theatre groups were organised. A performance on environmental issues, by Sukhmanch Theatre Group, on cleanliness by Asmita Theatre Group in pockets-K and L of Sheikh Sarai-II, and 'Plastic Paradox' by Dramanomics, CVS highlighted the hazardous effects of single-use plastics on our health and environment.

The Green Brigade organised a Nature Walk to Aravalli Biodiversity Park to celebrate the Wildlife Week. The students got a chance to engage with nature and appreciate its beauty and importance. In all, it was an enriching experience for the students as they got to explore the forest ecosystem along with the different conservatories like the orchid conservatory and also this enabled them to comprehend the symbiotic relationship between the different organisms.

E-waste collection drives were organised from 24 October 2018-1 November 2018 and from 11- 15 March 2019 in the college in association with Chintan Environmental Research and Action Group to spread awareness about the proper segregation and recycling of e-waste. We are happy to report that we managed to collect more than 896 kgs of E-waste.

We organised a workshop on 'Composting' in collaboration with Hara Jeevan NGO for the faculty members, gardeners and students of the college on 29 January 2019. The workshop was conducted by Ms Manisha Saini , CEO , Hara Jeevan.The session commenced by an interactive discussion on the significance and methods of composting. Heart- wrenching videos on plastic crisis was shown along with a presentation on Composting. The session ended by a practical demonstration on how to incorporate the wet waste from the canteen in the existing Compost Pit of the college.

We also organised a workshop titled, 'Green the Red' on 6 February 2019 in collaboration with Boondh. The workshop was conducted by Ms Sonal Jain, cofounder, Boondh and she highlighted the significance and importance of 'Sustainable Living and Menstrual Hygiene'. It was an enlightening talk for all the students, especially the girls who were made aware of the ecofriendly and biodegradable alternatives to the sanitary napkins and other products they currently use. She talked about the harmful effects of the plastic-made sanitary napkins on female health as well as the environment. Along with this, Ms Sonal also discussed the advantages of living a sustainable and minimalistic life. This event helped in breaking the taboos and the stigma around menstruation as well as sensitized the women to choose more greener and safer products.

A nest-making workshop was organised on 29 March 2019 in collaboration with Eco Roots Foundation and was attended by 75 students, teachers and non-teaching staff. Eminent environmentalist Mr Rakesh Khatri guided the students on how to make ecofriendly nests for the birds, especially the sparrows whose population is dwindling at an alarming rate. He highlighted the importance of conservation of a sustainable ecosystem that ensures habitation of all its elements without endangering the other elements. The nests made during the workshop have been hanged on the trees throughout the College campus.

Another new initiative taken by the Green Brigade is to give E-certificates to the society members, participants and winners of the various competitions, to reduce the usage of paper.

Project Raah

We aimed at implementing the cobblers' inherent skills to renew old donated shoes and resell the refurbished footwear to slum dwellers at a reasonable price, thus making the maximum utilization of scarce resources. It is a powerful and sustainable way for poor cobblers to uplift themselves and several other families out of poverty. Hence, our Project Raah is a three way action plan to combat discrimination, poverty and waste generation

This Year Progress-

Last year we had 4 cobblers under our umbrella, and this year we added 6 more cobblers in our project bringing the total to 10

We conducted 6 donations drives in following places,

1. DAV Public School, Sahibabad
2. Kendriya Vidhyalya, Gurugram
3. Womenite, NGO
4. IIT-Delhi
5. ARSD College
6. AIACTR- IP University

From these drives, we collected approximately 1500 shoes. The shoes were sorted and some were distributed among our cobblers to refurbish and sell further and some were directly given to slum dwellers.

This year, we collaborated with JUST Sports, a shoe manufacturing company, who provides us the defective shoes at a nominal price. These shoes are given to our cobblers who repair the defects and sell them as new at higher prices. This process, hence counters the industrial waste problem and increases the cobbler's income. Till now we have bought 800 shoes from Just Sports.

We have also collaborated with NGO Humari Pehchan who help us in selling and distributing footwear in slums.

Since the past month, we have also been working on manufacturing low cost new slippers for the cobblers to make themselves and sell. We are also looking to set up working-cum-manufacturing places for our cobblers.

Project Madari

We visited GT Karnal Road for sustainability of our beneficiary. There we tapped various dhabas and restaurants. Out of all, one dhaba namely "GulshanDhaba" agreed to support and give employment to our beneficiary Mr. Babban Khan on regular basis.

Visits were made to Ghaziabad where Mr. Babban Khan lives, in order to make our members get to know about the way how we work in Madari and to know more about our beneficiary by interacting with him.

3. Kathputli Colony

Our team has visited Kathputli Colony thrice for research on Madari Project. Many residents of Kathputli colony know us and support our initiative and actively work with us.

4. Saket Police station and DCP office

We made a visit to DCP office and police station in order to gain more knowledge about the rights of Madari and whether they can perform on streets without any legal charges.

We made a website for him with all his requirements and taught him how to handle queries from it. Now he gets a lot shows from there and always thanks us for the help.
