Its price, however, is notoriously variable because of the dramatic price increase caused by the Pandemic and the ongoing Russia-Ukraine war. He also explained why oil prices are so variable. Oil is a product that is fungible and tradable. Auctions are used to buy and sell oil. The demand and supply of oil is inelastic and the main reasons for this are that 95% of vehicles operate on oil along with some geopolitical reasons.

The attendees discovered how an increase in Oil Price can lead to Recession. The first oil shock occurred in 1973, then the Iran War (OPEC Member) raised prices again in 1978, which was followed by a recession. High inflation, a budget deficit, a current account deficit, and declining currency reserves are the macroeconomic consequences.

Following that, a question and answer session was held, during which Mr. Kashyap answered students' questions and clarified their problems. Teachers were also thrilled to be able to join the session. The seminar concluded with a vote of thanks from the President of ECONOX to Mr.Kashyap. A token of gratitude was extended to Mr. Kashyap in the form of a sapling by Dr. Ashis Taru Deb, Teacher Incharge of the economics department at College of Vocational Studies, Delhi University.

About the speaker

Mr. Bhaskar J. Kashyap is an Assistant Director at Niti Aayog. Before this, he has been a consultant at Ernst & Young and worked with UNICEF.

The teams were allotted 90 minutes for research and submitting their policies in the form of a presentation. The teams, then, had to present their PPTs in front of the judges, who were the Economics professors of College of Vocational Studies.

The participants delivered outstanding presentations, showcasing their skills and creativity. The two best teams were declared the winners of the event.

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FOOTBALL FANTASY FANATIC

The Economic Summit 4.0, the flagship event of ECONOX, The Economics Department of College of Vocational Studies, was held on 7th and 8th February 2023 and was a huge success. A football-themed event called "Football Fantasy Fanatic" was held as part of the main event on 7th February.

The Football Fantasy Fanatic, or FFF, was a stirring event for all football enthusiasts. It not only tested the participants' football knowledge, but it also evoked feelings of excitement and team spirit. The event got more than 150 registrations from multiple colleges. Teams had to make careful decisions to ensure that they got top players while keeping their budget from falling below zero. The auction began with marquee players such as Messi and Ronaldo, and prices reached 170 million dollars. All of the teams demonstrated excellent strategic skills, high spirits, and a competitive nature, with everyone attempting to outbid the others.

With all of the rounds completed and everyone in anticipation, it was time to announce the winner of the event. The total points and remaining budget for each team were computed. In the end, three teams were declared winners.

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EQUITY BAZAAR: CVS' VERY OWN SHARK TANK

INDUSTRIAL VISIT TO COCA-COLA October 7, 2022

On **7th October 2022**, Team ComSoc successfully organised an industrial visit to the **Coca-Cola Happiness Factory** situated in Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh. **32** members along with **two faculty members** visited the factory to acquire knowledge about the basic working, production and management process of the company.

The students gathered in front of the college entrance at around 9:30 in the morning. Following a bus journey of 2 hours, they reached the venue at 11:30 am.

Coca-Cola company is a widely famous American multinational beverage corporation which was founded in 1892. Best known for the production of Coca-Cola, its headquarters is situated in Atlanta, Georgia, United States. Currently operating 58 water-intensive bottling plants in India, the biggest one is situated in Greater Noida which the team visited.

After reaching the venue, the students were guided by two employees and were given a briefing of rules and guidelines to be obeyed by everyone inside the factory. This was followed by an overview about the main products of the company such as Mazza, Thums up, Sprite etc. and an interesting exhibition of old advertisements designed by the company. Then an informative short film was shown to the students which contained a bunch of interesting facts like the company has over 3000+ products and 500+ brands.

After that, the students were taken inside the vault where the manufacturing process was explained. The whole team observed how the cans are manufactured, the quality tests taken place and what is done with the rejected ones. Everyone was also made aware of the fact that only 2 people in the world know the secret formula of 'Coca-Cola'. The whole team was told that the average production of the cans is 10 to 12 lakhs per day and had made a record of producing 37 lakhs cans in 24 hours. Thereafter, the evolution of their bottles was shown which was followed by an insightful Q&A session.

Everyone's questions and doubts were answered patiently.

Before leaving, unlimited drinks were offered to the team and the students thoroughly enjoyed their time by playing some fun VR games together. At last, a group photo was clicked and everyone reached the college at around 4 in the evening.

The industrial visit to the Coca-Cola factory enriched everyone's practical knowledge and provided the society a great opportunity to learn and gain some experience through demonstration and interaction.

INDUSTRIAL VISIT TO SEBI March 16, 2023

On **16th March 2023**, Team ComSoc successfully organised an industrial visit to the **Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI)** office in INA, Delhi. **70 members** along with two faculty members visited the office to learn about the financial markets and the functioning of the regulatory framework governing the Indian securities market. SEBI is a statutory body established on April 12,1992 in accordance with the provisions of the Securities and Exchange Board of India Act, 1992. The basic function of the SEBI is to protect the interest of investors in securities and to promote the regulation of the securities market.

The members were divided into **two batches** of 35 each. The first batch reached the office at 11 am and received a warm welcome. They were escorted inside the conference room where the students were briefed by the **Northern Regional Manager of SEBI, Ms. Nanu Kaur Ma'am** about SEBI's role in regulating the securities market and promoting the investors' interests. She then elucidated the history of SEBI, its integration with regional stock exchanges as well as the need for exchange in the market and the agencies that look after it. She further talked about the depository system and elaborated upon SEBI's role as a regulator that ensures fair trading in the market.

Major functions of SEBI were discussed along with the legal framework and its enforcement powers. After the basic briefing, students were made aware of the do's and don'ts for investing in the financial markets and the necessary precautions to be kept in mind for the same. The manager then conducted a Q&A session to ensure that the information was well grasped by everyone. Moreover, she showed some videos to create awareness about numerous issues like unrealistic returns, SEBI's online grievance redressal system, SCORES, etc.

Thereafter, the students met the **Director of Northern Regional Area, Mr. Rajesh Kumar Dangeti**, who emphasised on the importance of research before investing in a financial asset.

This was followed by a tour of the SEBI office, where the students witnessed real-time trading sessions and learnt about the cutting-edge technologies used there.

The visit concluded with the distribution of snacks and booklets containing information about SEBI and the financial markets. Finally, a group photo was clicked. The first batch of students left, followed by the arrival of the second batch at 12 pm who had a similar experience that continued for an hour.

Overall, the industrial visit to Securities and Exchange Board of India enhanced the financial acumen and practical knowledge of the students. It certainly presented the attendees with an excellent exposure to learn and acquire financial expertise through observation.

Later, westarted to cater for another problem around the 'underutilisation of goat milk' which leads tolow and unstable income for goat herders. This led to the creation of 'Ayuda Skin Care+' soaps which are made out of 'goat milk'.

Our Communities

As of now, our project works closely with 2 communities. The first community is Sewa Bharti, an NGO based in Rohini, New Delhi. The second community is Jagrukta SHG, an SHG based out of Ropar, Punjab, in collaboration with the Government of Punjab.

Additionally, we strive to maintain the dying Indian pottery culture.

Our products

There are four different flavours of Ikhtiraa tea bags: lemongrass chamomile, chamomile, lavender and tulsi.

Instead of the usual paper plastic, the tea bags are made of muslin cloth. The tea bags are hand-sewn by people of our linked community instead of using staples.

Our local potter community is our source of clay items.

Our partners

Project Ikhtiraa is in the first year of its life cycle. Our current partner for the project is the Young Women's Christian Association (YWCA) in Delhi, which is an organisation dedicated to upliftingwomen in all spheres of life.

RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

Enactus CVS's Research & Development Department consists of two wings that focus on internal work and external collaborations. They follow a process of problem identification, ideation, market analysis, competitor analysis, and prototyping to bring projects to fruition. This year, the department aims to elevate existing projects to new levels by expanding them.

On-ground visits

Enactus CVS organized on-ground visits which allowed the members to gain practical knowledge and gather information about the ongoing projects along with ideas about new projects.

In addition to the aforementioned, the R&D department has also undertaken various other endeavours which are as follows:-

Market research around tea bags

As a part of one of our projects, market research was conducted to collect data of flavours of the tea which were most prevalent in the market; these flavours were then tested and the ones with the maximum consumer response were launched. Research on the shape of the tea bags and packaging was also conducted followed by prototyping. Two-level packaging was developed to ensure product protection and enhance freshness. The R&d department has researched the following during this tenure-

Coffee cherry pulp: For every kilogram of roasted coffee that people consume, an equal amount of waste is left behind in the producing countries; so to tackle this problem, the discarded coffee cherry pulp can be upcycled and turned into flour which has various applications.

Hydroponics: It is a subset of Hydroculture, which means growing plants without soil using mineral nutrient solutions in an aqueous solvent ensuring a high production rate and increasing water efficiency by 90%.

Seaweed protein bars: As seaweed is now gaining popularity for its versatility and is rich in roughage which helps mitigate the major problem in protein bars, our team came up with this idea to incorporate edible seaweed with protein bars providing a healthier and sustainable option for consumers.

BSG cookies: Every year, tons of Brewers' Spent Grain(used in the production of barley-based beverages) is sent to the landfill or used to feed livestock, instead of utilizing it. As most of the carbohydrate and sugar content has been extracted for the production of the beer itself, the BSG is left with fibre and protein making it nutritious. The objective is to make guilt-free, savoury, and sweet treats(starting with cookies), creating a healthy snacking alternative.

DIVERSIFICATION & PRODUCT EXPANSION

HUL(Hindustan Unilever Limited) to diversify and expand the product line of Project Abyaan. They focused on converting UCO soaps from hand soaps to bathing soaps, using natural and environmentally friendly ingredients, and extending their shelf life. They also explored the potential uses of UCO beyond soaps, such as lamp oil, car

cleaner, and paint remover. Extensive research on coffee soaps was also conducted to develop the recipe and method from scratch.

Certification & Licensing

A newly added vertical of Project Abyaan which comes up with soaps made out of coffee grounds has been researched and recently tested and certified by the lab.

Enactus CVS also came up with Tea bags made from muslin cloth that attenuates the microplastics present. These tea bags have been tested by labs and certified, making them safe to consume.

Training

Enactus CVS provides training programs to both community members and newly recruited members, including skills such as reverse engineering and pitching to potential clients. These activities enable members to develop valuable skills like project ideation and contribute to the growth of Enactus' vision. Additionally, Enactus CVS offers skill development sessions to communities involved in their projects to hone their existing skills or acquire new ones.

EXTERNAL COLLABORATIONS

Enactus CVS is also involved in establishing self-help groups in **Najafgarh** as a collaboration with the Delhi government under the National Urban Livelihood Mission. The goal is to create self-sustaining large-scale businesses and generate employment opportunities for women. The department's efforts in this area have gained recognition, including coverage in newspapers and appreciation from current Revenue and Transport Minister of Delhi, Shri Kailash Gehlot.

The scholars from JNU and Jamia Millia Islamia University and other institutions visited the Library for literature search & data collection on Vocational Subjects/topics during the year. OPAC search facility also available for Library collection to its users.

The teachers and students were provided with tables equipped with laptop connectivity and Wi-Fi for preparing their course contents lessons, and assignments sitting in the Library. The teachers and students were given the access to e-resources of UGC/INFLIBNET and various databases which are provided by University. Our college Library also provide the online OPAC for its users.

Study Centre No. 7103 has been successfully running at the College, for providing counseling in M.B.A., M.Com. and M.T.M. From January 2023, IGNOU STUDY CENTRE has been closed.
