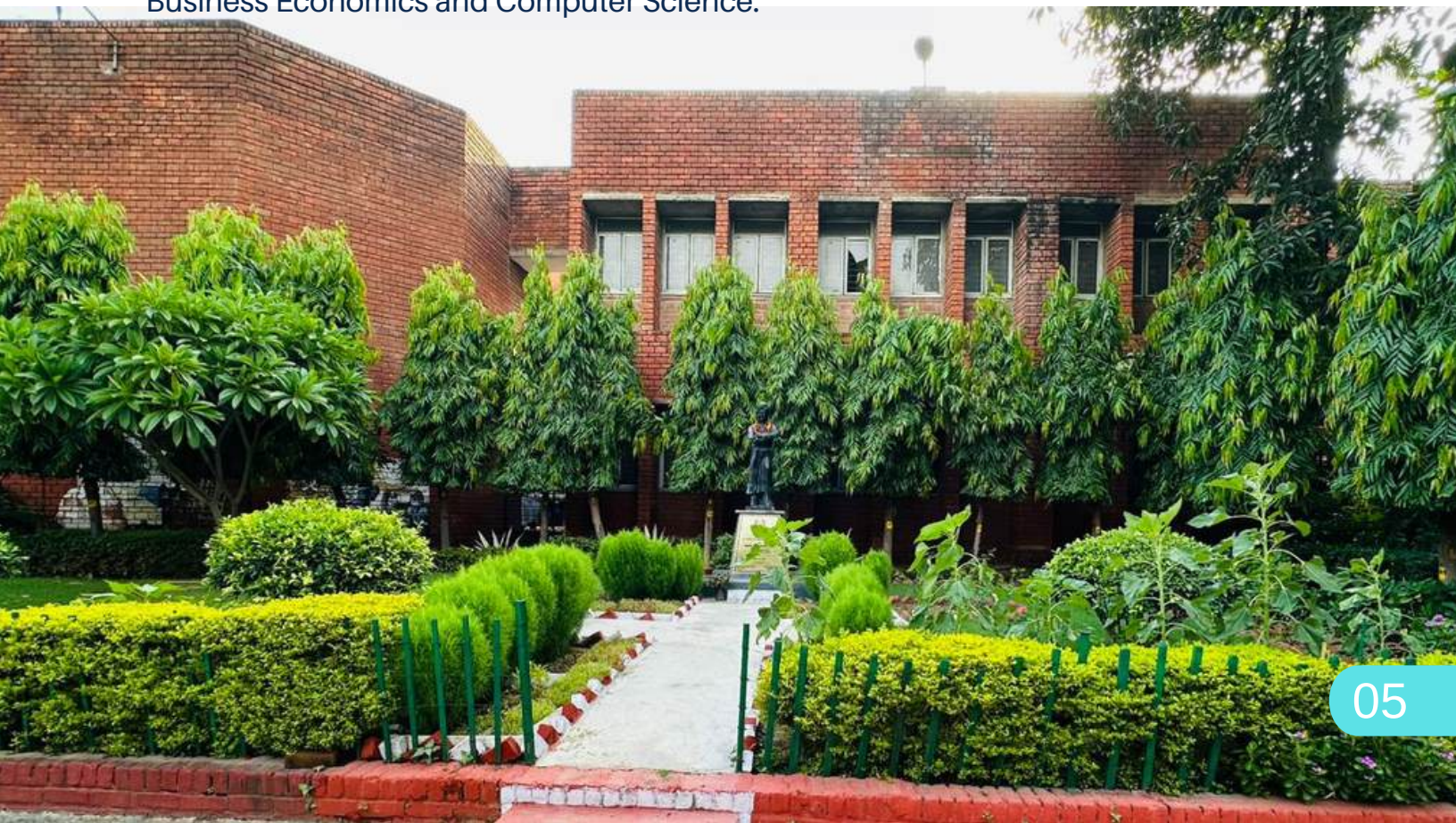


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ABOUT THE COLLEGE

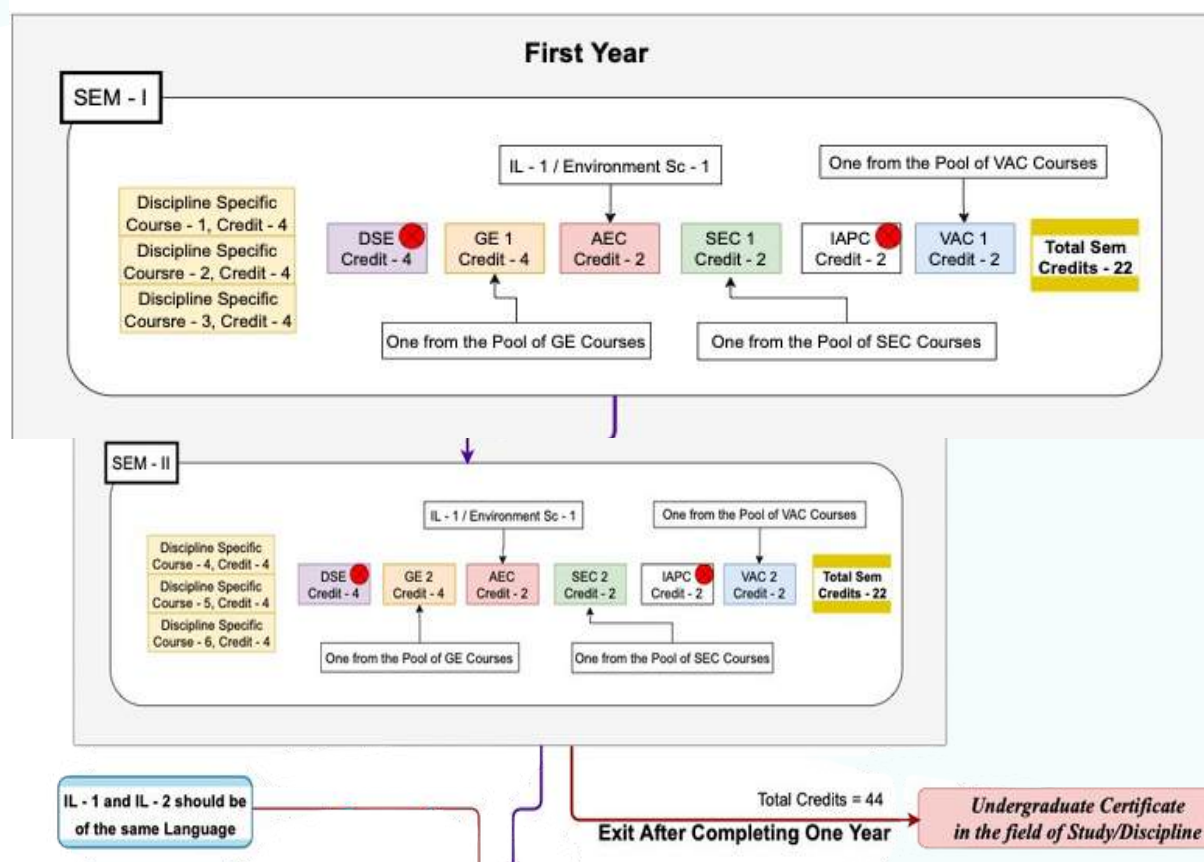

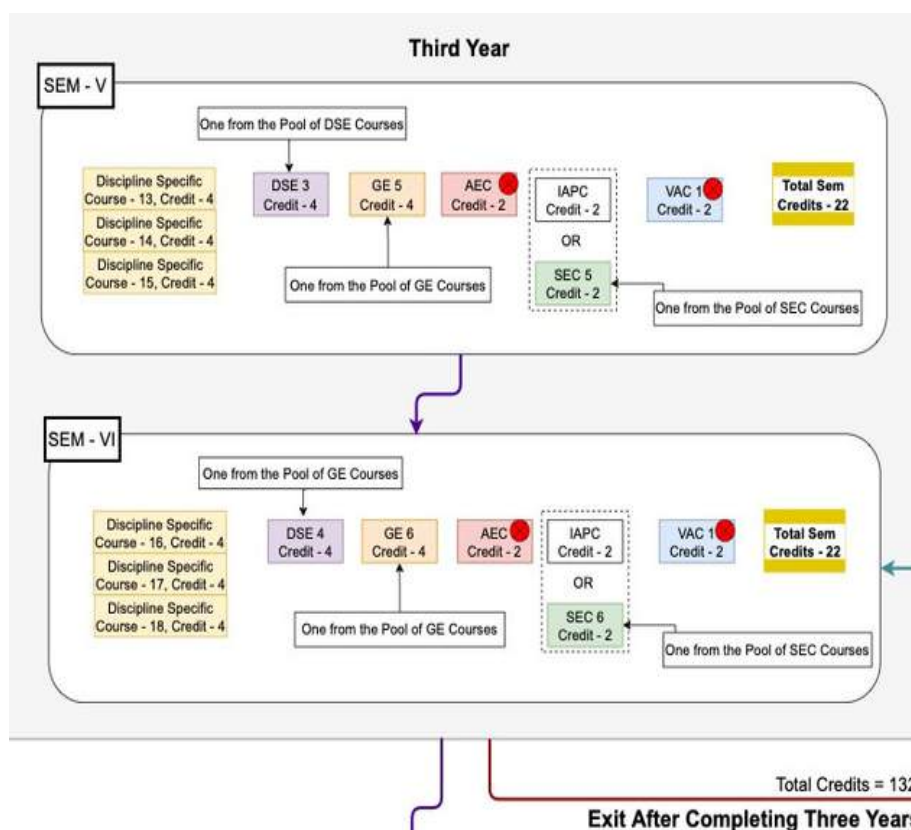
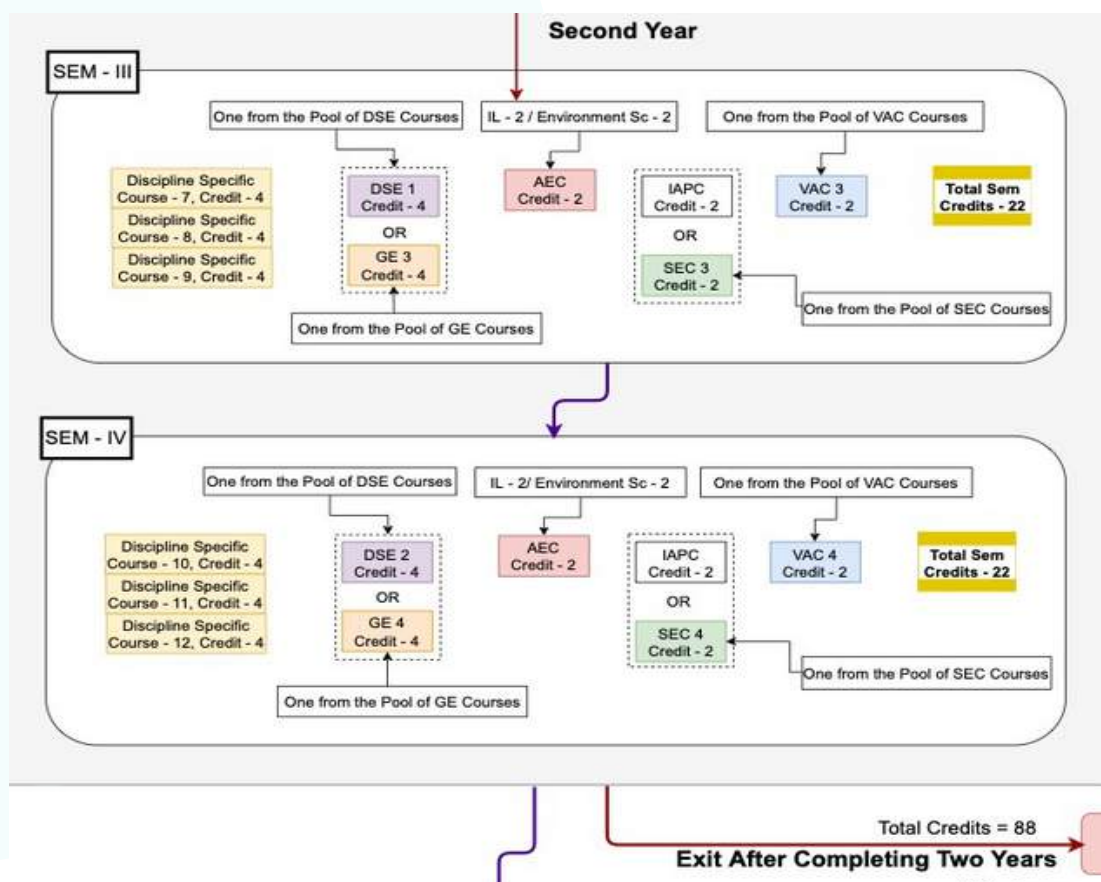

Structure of UG Single Core Discipline Program

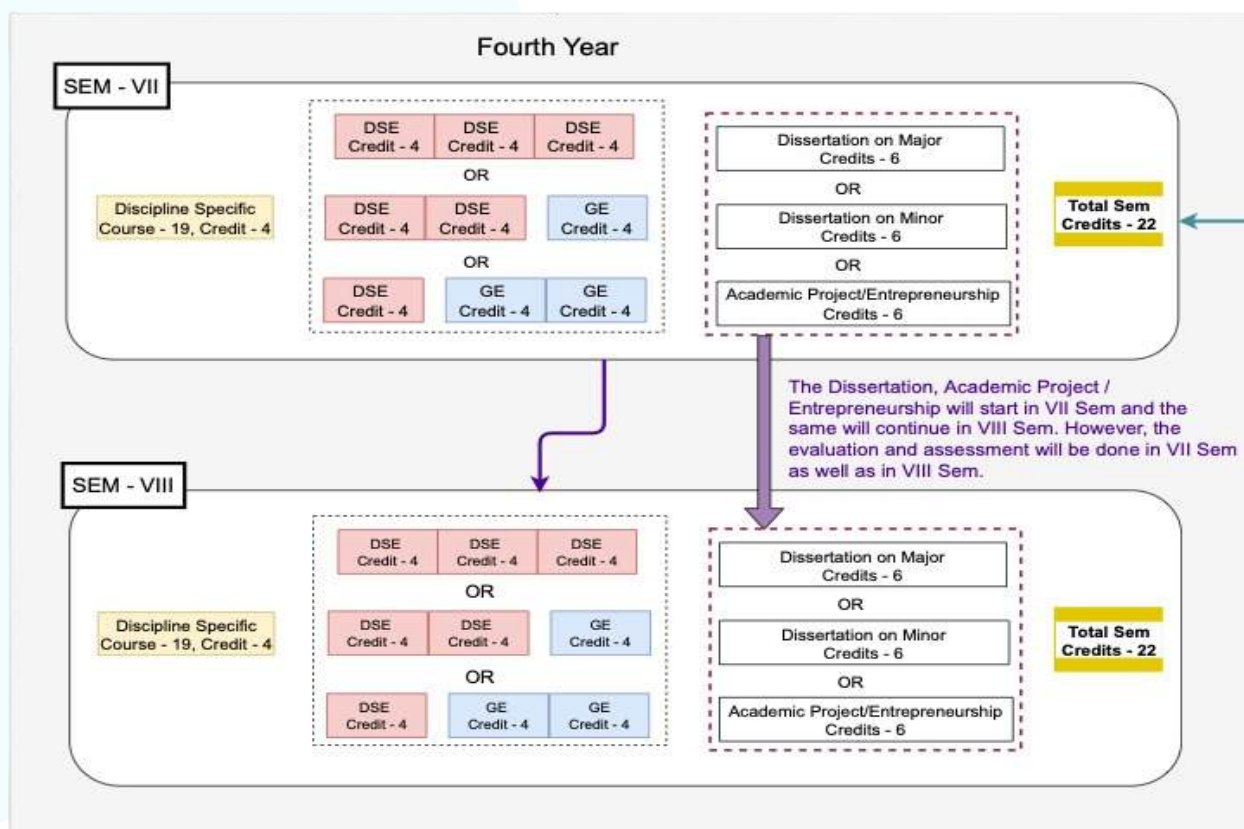

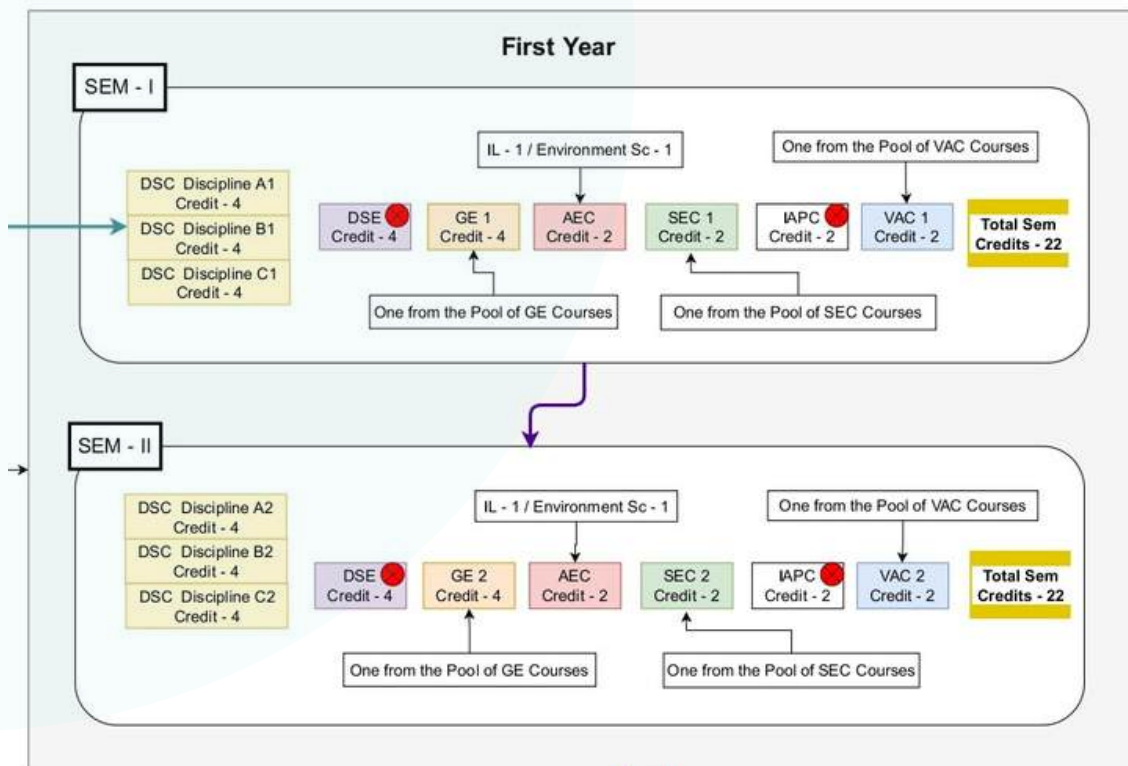

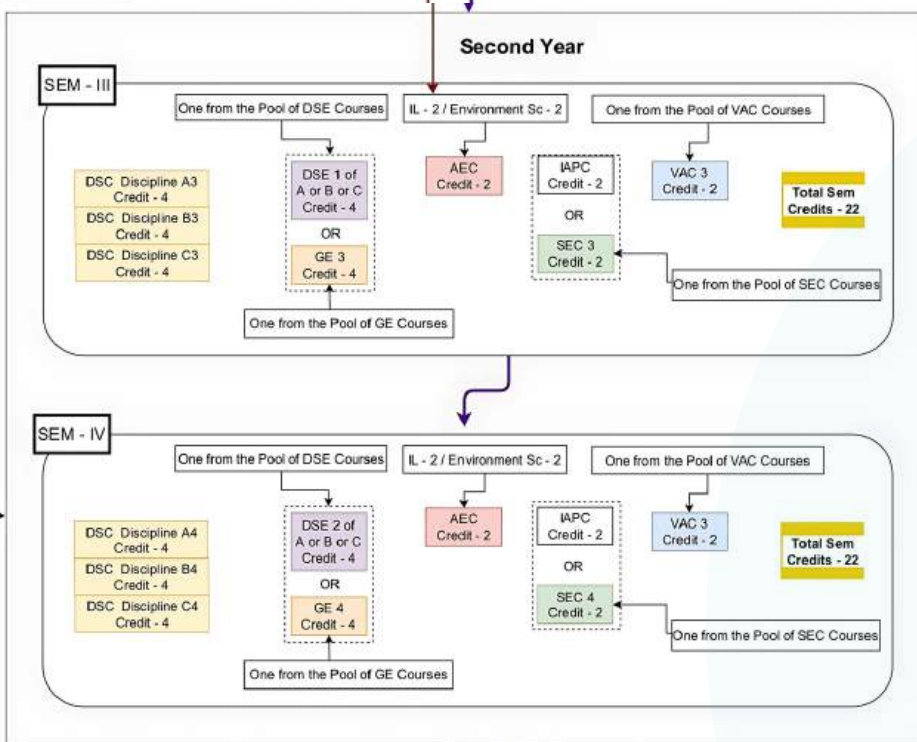

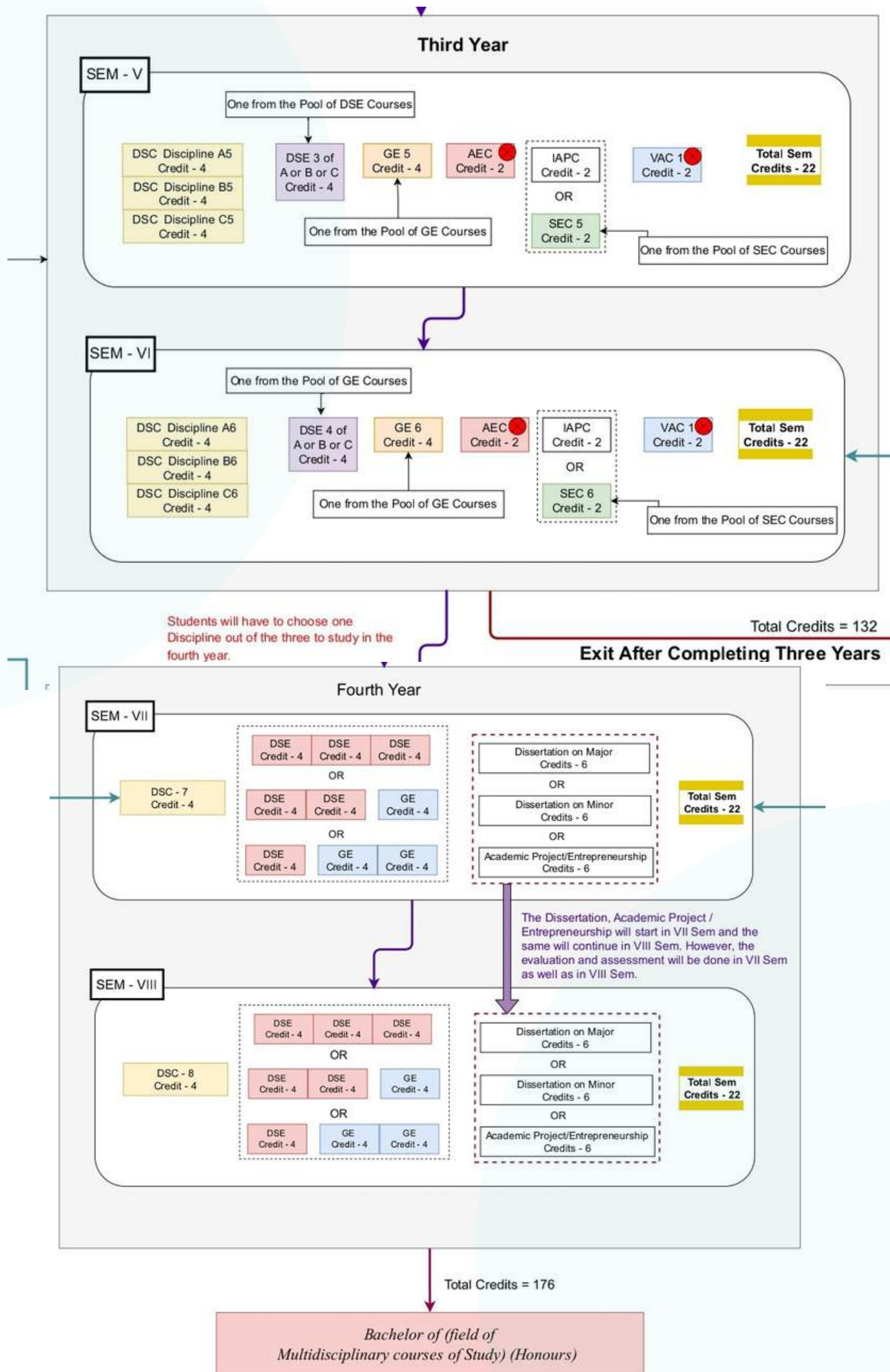

Exit After Completing Two Years

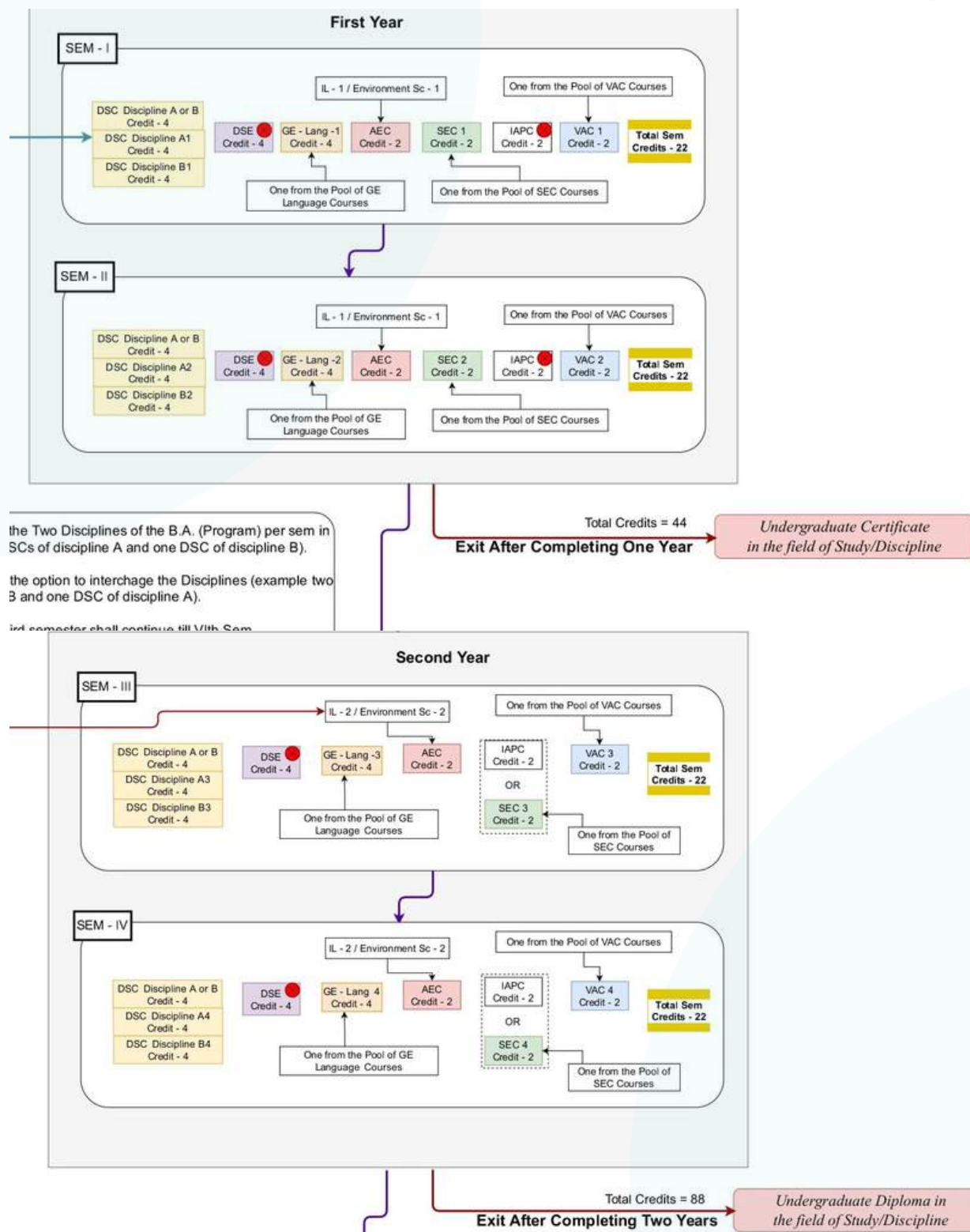
Undergraduate Diploma in the field of Study/Discipline



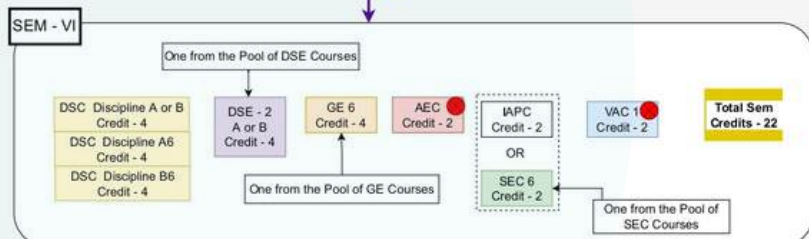
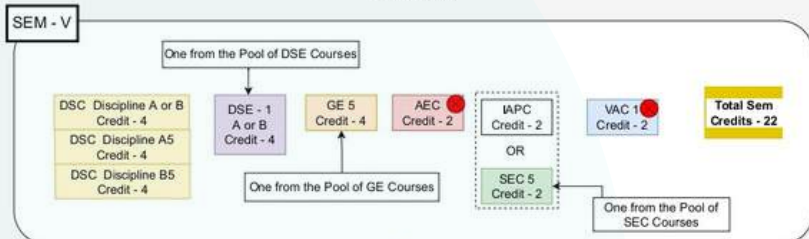

SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE

The college has established a dedicated Scholarship Committee to support students in need. All faculty members contribute to the scholarship funds on a monthly basis, demonstrating their commitment to helping students succeed. Students with a family income of less than ₹4 lakhs per annum are encouraged to apply for financial assistance. The application process is open and accessible to ensure that deserving candidates are aware of this opportunity. Once applications are received, the committee meticulously reviews each one, taking care to assess the individual circumstances of every applicant. This thorough process ensures that financial aid is distributed efficiently and reaches those who need it most.

PRINCIPAL INTERNSHIP SCHEME 2025

To foster the professional and holistic development of students, the college launched the Principal Internship Scheme, inspired by the Vice Chancellor's Internship Scheme at the University level in 2025. Owing to an overwhelming response, the initiative will now be conducted annually.

In its inaugural year, 60 students have been selected through a rigorous screening process to benefit from the program. Of these, 30 students have been offered Academic Session Internships, involving 200 hours of work with a stipend of Rs. 10,000. The remaining 30 students have been selected for Summer Internships, requiring 120 hours of work and offering a stipend of Rs. 5,000. These internships aim to provide students with meaningful exposure to institutional functioning, contributing significantly to their personal and professional growth.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of the College of Vocational Studies, University of Delhi, functions with the core motto "Not Me, But You," instilling a sense of social responsibility among students. In the 2024–25 session, with active participation of over 100 volunteers, NSS CVS collaborated with various government and non-government bodies like MCD, NDMC, and MoHUA. Under Project Rati, over 2000 sanitary pads were distributed, and self-defense workshops for girls were organized. Environmental efforts under Project Vanikaran led to the plantation of 1500+ saplings and over 30 cleanliness drives, including campus fogging. Project AAS focused on stray animal care and kindness awareness, while the Paathshala Project provided regular elementary education to underprivileged children. Volunteers also assisted daily at Safdarjung Hospital and a team of 10 visited Koderma, Jharkhand for Project Swachh Sankalp, earning recognition from IAS Ankita Chakravarti.





NSS CVS organized multiple Recycle Melas promoting sustainable waste practices. Its Electoral Literacy Club (ELC) was awarded Best ELC by the Chief Election Commissioner. The unit also participated in the NSS National Integration Camp in Jaipur and hosted its own 7-day NSS Special Camp. Two major events, Deepmahotsav (Oct 2024) and Odyssey (Apr 2025), each saw over 5000 attendees and were celebrated as zero-waste events. Through diverse initiatives, NSS CVS contributed meaningfully to society while nurturing leadership and empathy in its volunteers.

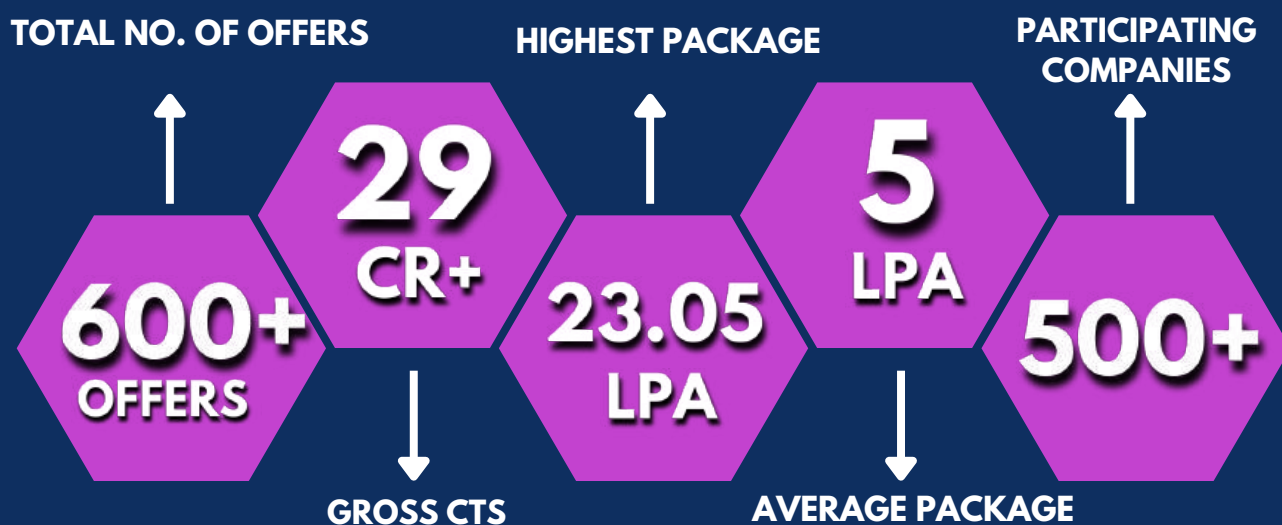
INTERNAL QUALITY ASSESSMENT CELL (IQAC)

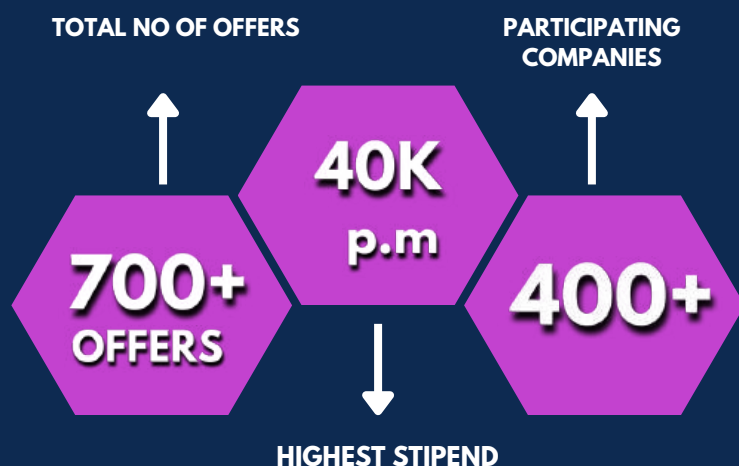


PLACEMENT SEASON 2024 -25

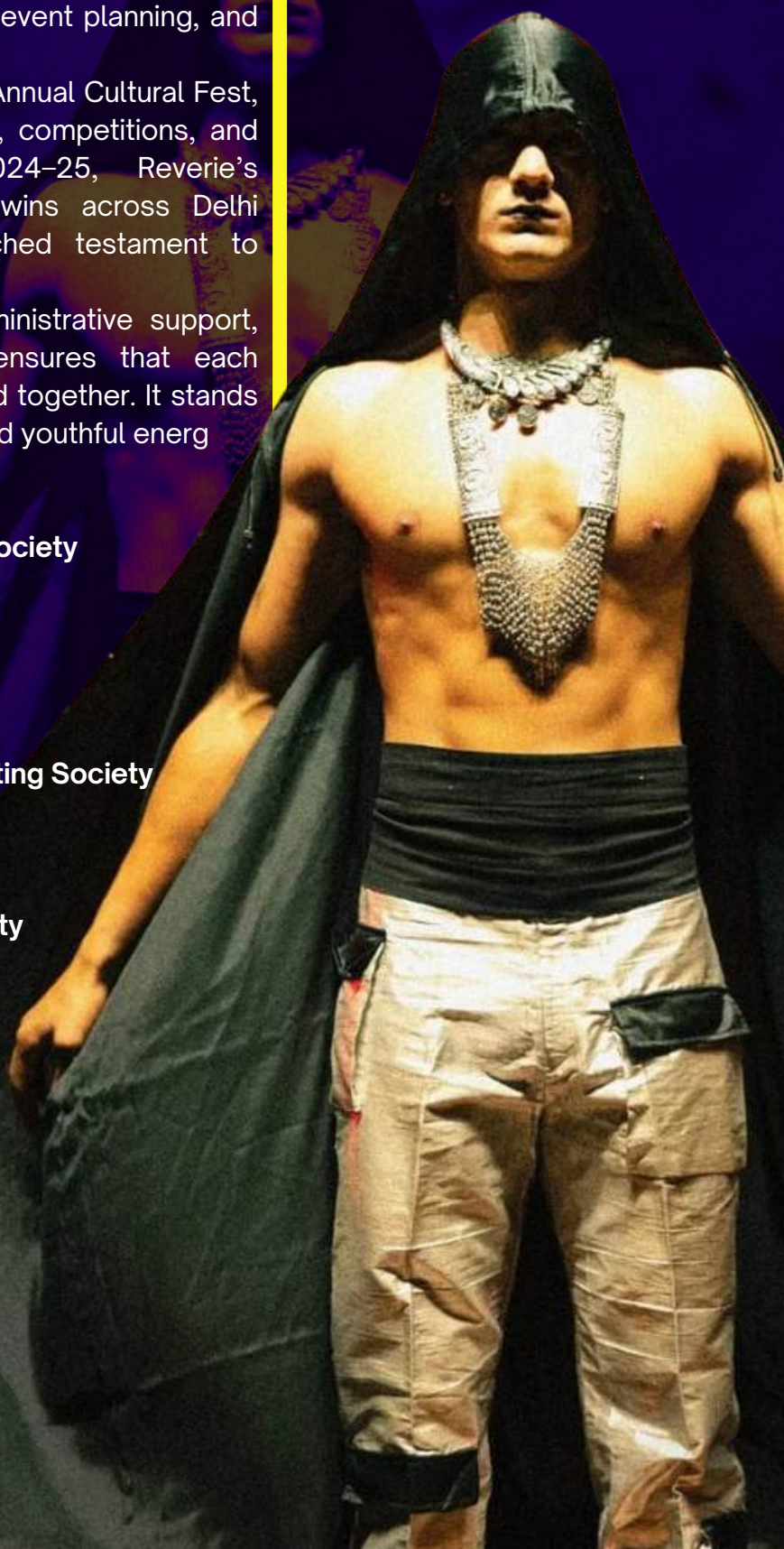

In 2024-25, the society organised regular film screenings of prescribed texts, speaker sessions on emerging literary trends, and visits to prominent cultural sites such as the Partition Museum and Pearl Academy. Theatre outings and orientation sessions further enriched the literary exposure of the students.

The academic year culminated in the annual fest Ink and Ivory, which brought together poetry, prose, and performance. This year's celebration was graced by alumna Pragya Saini as the chief guest, inspiring students with her journey. Through its multifaceted initiatives, Elysium continues to be the creative and intellectual pulse of the college.



Enactus CVS continues to lead with purpose at the College of Vocational Studies by combining entrepreneurial spirit with sustainable development. This year, the team successfully executed three impactful projects—Ikhtiraa (combating microplastic consumption), Ehtiyaat (recycling single-use plastics), and Abyaan (converting used cooking oil into hygiene products). Our campaigns tackled pressing issues such as men's mental health, plastic pollution, and the spirit of giving—engaging diverse communities through public awareness drives, NGO collaborations, and community outreach. We also organized the inauguration of Project Impulse, a collaborative initiative to promote youth volunteerism, in the presence of leading NGOs and Mr. Himanshu Joshi, Director, NITI Aayog. Our year culminated in Entrigue'25, our flagship event themed on Entrepreneurship and Benevolence. It featured thought-provoking panel discussions, a dynamic case competition, artisan engagement through pottery stalls, tote bag painting, and book exchanges. Enactus CVS secured the 1st Runner-Up position at the B-Plan competition at the Annual Event of Enactus MAIMS and was 2nd Runner-Up at Symphony.





ENCRYPT : THE TECH SOCIETY

Encrypt, the official Tech and Gaming Society of CVS, led by Convenor Ms. Parul Chachra, carried forward its spirit of innovation and collaboration in 2024-25. The society's flagship event, Technophilia, drew widespread participation across the university and featured exciting segments like hackathons, coding challenges, gaming tournaments, and design battles.

Throughout the year, Encrypt remained active with fresher orientation sessions, interactive workshops, and in-house competitions that kept technical curiosity and creativity alive. The team also strengthened its digital presence by curating tech-based content and engaging reels on trending innovations.

Blending fun with learning, Encrypt continues to offer a platform where students explore technology hands-on, develop key digital skills, and build a vibrant tech community. With a focus on creativity, collaboration, and practical exposure, Encrypt remains at the forefront of tech engagement at CVS.





THE ENTREPRENEURIAL BOARD (TEB)

The Entrepreneurial Board of CVS is one of India's leading e-cells. Our objective is to promote entrepreneurship through networking, events, and incubation. We organize several significant programs throughout the year such as startup expo, seminars, speaker sessions, group discussions, interviews, etc., for the grooming, counseling and recruitment of students. The TEB provides students the opportunity to meet and learn from market leaders. In our Bi-annual event E-GNITE 2024, students pitched eight startups to the top investors. For connecting these startups to the investors, TEB collaborates with brands such as Spotify and others. Moreover, we organize industry visits to enhance the knowledge of students and provide them a chance to step beyond textbooks and witness the real world workings of production, supply chain management and quality control of the industries. Our efforts have been recognized by the Campus Innovator Award at the Global D2C Summit 2025, which showcases TEB's impact in the startup ecosystem.





ERIC – ENTREPRENEURSHIP, RESEARCH & INCUBATION CENTRE

ERIC at the College of Vocational Studies, University of Delhi, is a dynamic ecosystem that empowers student entrepreneurs through mentorship, incubation, and strategic collaboration. Going beyond events, ERIC provides a hands-on platform where ideas are nurtured into viable ventures. Successful editions of Startup Nexus (2024 & 2025) connected students with industry mentors and potential investors, while internal events like Pitch Perfect and Business Plan competitions encouraged entrepreneurial thinking on campus.

ERIC also incubates student-led startups such as Kofi Kafi, Paper Box, and Paragon Peak, offering them consistent guidance and ecosystem support. The Centre fosters long-term growth by engaging with startups across DU, promoting real-world learning and collaboration. What sets ERIC apart is its commitment to meaningful, student-driven entrepreneurship—where innovation meets execution and vision turns into enterprise





THE FINANCE AND INVESTMENT CELL

The Finance and Investment Cell of CVS successfully delivered a year focused on enhancing financial literacy and analytical acumen. The society organised two flagship events in 2024–25 that encouraged practical learning and strategic thinking. Finesco 7.0, an inter-college financial competition, tested participants on concepts of finance, investment, and business strategy through dynamic, multi-stage rounds. It attracted wide participation and emerged as a standout event.

The second event, Cascade, was a case study competition designed to simulate real-world financial challenges. Students applied theoretical knowledge to practical business problems, honing their decision-making and problem-solving skills. Both events underscored the society's mission to foster financial awareness, intellectual engagement, and application-based learning within the student community.





GREEN BRIGADE: THE ENVIRONMENT SOCIETY

Green Brigade, The Environment Society of CVS, is committed to leading positive change in our college campus by promoting sustainability, conservation, and innovation. Our mission is to educate, inspire, and empower students to take action towards environmental sustainability through awareness, education, and hands-on activities. We envision a future where the youth are environmentally conscious and actively work towards mitigating environmental degradation, transforming 'Generation Z' into 'Generation Green'. To achieve this vision, we aim to empower young people to embrace sustainable living, conserve natural resources, and protect the environment. We have undertaken major projects such as PADS4PLANET, GREEN PLATE REVOLUTION, PROJECT ECOECHO, and PROJECT GYAN to address various environmental issues and promote sustainable practices in our community. Additionally, our campus implements GREEN PRACTICES such as composting, maintaining herbal and vegetable gardens, and waste segregation to reduce our environmental footprint. HEALTH AND HYGIENE COMMITTEE

The Health and Hygiene Committee of CVS serves as a cornerstone for health-related awareness, preventive action, and student welfare. The committee's primary objective is to ensure the physical, mental, and emotional well-being of both students and staff by adopting a proactive, inclusive, and awareness-driven approach. Moreover, it champions the creation and maintenance of a clean, hygienic, and safe campus environment. This involves ensuring access to sanitation facilities, promoting waste segregation and cleanliness drives. Among its core functions, the committee is entrusted with promoting awareness on vital topics such as personal hygiene, nutrition, and mental health. It regularly organizes wellness drives, health check-up camps, counseling sessions, menstrual hygiene awareness programmes, vaccination camps, and lectures by health professionals to educate the college community. Importantly, the committee plays a crucial role in substance abuse prevention. More than just a society, MANAS remains a movement of students committed to mental health advocacy with purpose and heart.

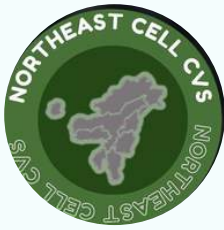




MERCADEO: THE MARKETING SOCIETY

Established in 2014 by a cohort of BMS students, MSOC - The Management Society is a hub for those passionate about management. Learning Facilities & Infrastructure

College Campus Overview

The College of Vocational Studies is spread across a serene 10-acre campus, thoughtfully designed to provide an ideal environment for academic and personal growth. The lush green lawns, seasonal blooms, and shaded walkways create a peaceful atmosphere conducive to learning. The original building comprises approximately 25 classrooms, alongside essential student spaces such as the Boys' and Girls' Common Rooms. Two new teaching blocks were recently added, featuring over 50 additional classrooms, a modern conference room, a dedicated yoga room, and upgraded washroom facilities. To streamline operations, the administrative and finance offices have been revamped and automated.





COLLEGE LIBRARY

The College has a well-stocked, fully computerized and airconditioned Library. It has three sections, namely reference section, textbook section and General section. The reading room provides newspapers and magazines for general reading. It also offers scholarly journals and periodicals for consultation. The rules for the use of the library are notified on the Notice Board by the Librarian from time to time. It has 62,130 books and approx. 550 bound scholarly journals in its stock comprising of a good number of valuable reference/ multidisciplinary books. The Library subscribes to 34 Journals and magazines and 12 newspapers for its users. The Library Reading Room remains open from 9:00 am to 5:30 pm. The Library is well known for its valuable, rare and unique; unique collection of study material on vocational/ management subjects. The teachers and students are provided Internet connectivity and Laptops for preparing their course contents, lessons, assignments, etc., along with access to e-resources such as INFLIBNET-NLIST for further study and research works.

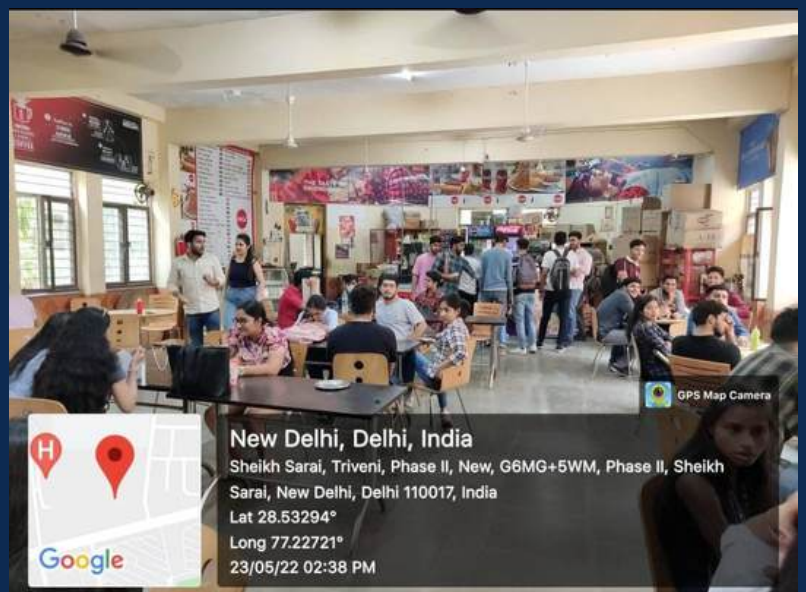
COMPUTER LABS

The college hosts two new state-of-the-art computer laboratories equipped with 80 high-performance systems and advanced networking capabilities. Two more new computer labs are in the process of making with advanced facilities. These labs are outfitted with essential software for programming, research, and academic tasks. 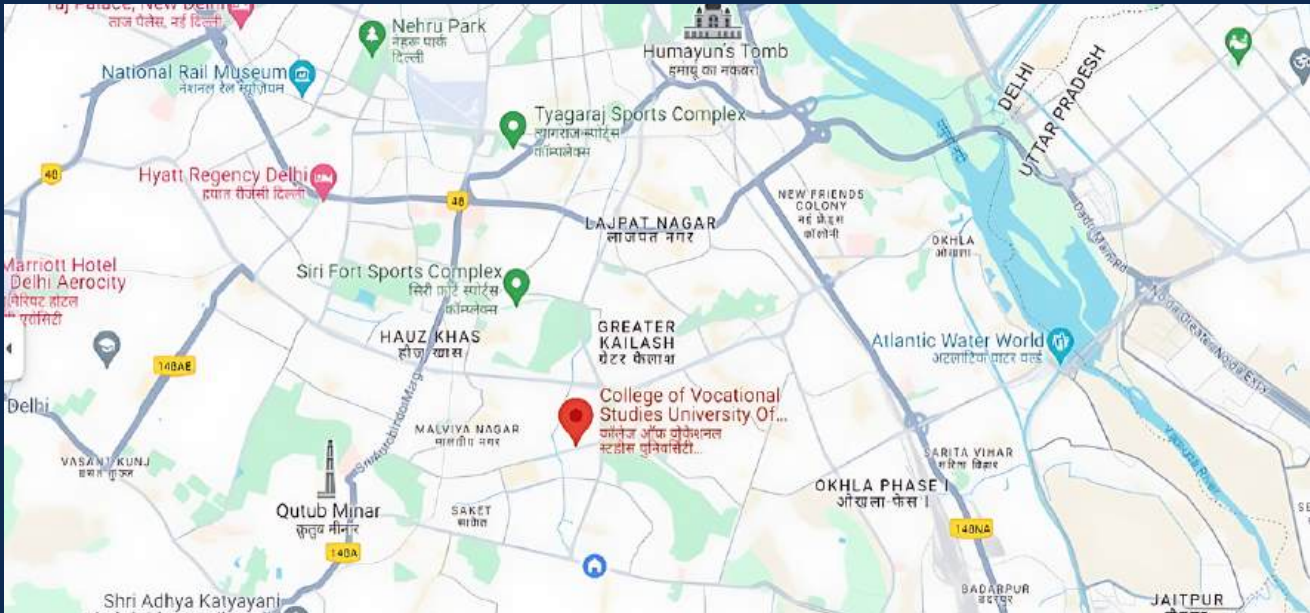
